Drouhin Oregon Roserock is the newest chapter in the Drouhin story, extending from Burgundy's Côte d'Or and Chablis, to the Dundee Hills of Oregon, and now Oregon's Eola-Amity Hills. Drouhin Oregon Roserock continues a four-generation story that began in 1880 when Joseph Drouhin moved from Chablis to Beaune, in the heart of Burgundy.

The wines were crafted with the usual Drouhin techniques: marrying balance, harmony, finesse and character.

Roserock is an extraordinary vineyard at the southern tip of the Eola-Amity Hills, in Oregon's Willamette Valley. Ancient volcanic soils, an ideal elevation range and the unique cooling effect of the Van Duzer corridor produce classic cool-climate Pinot Noir and Chardonnay. About Our Eola-Amity Hills Pinot Noir

Our Roserock Pinot Noir is a cuvée selection from the estate's 35 blocks, which are handpicked, sorted and individually fermented. While Pinot Noirs from the Eola-Amity Hills are typically known for their structure and power, Véronique Drouhin emphasizes Roserock's elegant and refined qualities, making for a delicious and ageworthy cuvée.

The Pinot Noir was aged for 11 months in approximately 20% French Oak. There wasn't any whole cluster used during fermentation, and we were very excited to ferment each block separately to better understand the personality of each parcel.

The 2014 Vintage - 2014 is already considered a classic Oregon vintage. A long, warm growing season and a relaxed, bountiful harvest has given us Pinot Noir with lovely color, beautiful fruit-forward character, excellent balance and the structure to age well. It is a perfect way to debut Roserock.

Véronique's Tasting Notes - Our 2014 Roserock Pinot Noir has a lovely, deep red color. The nose is floral, spicy and beautiful, with an intense, savory, character. On the palate, there are notes of dark berry preserves, a touch of caramel, black cherry, dried flowers, and tilled earth. There is clear structure and balance, with good mouth weight and a long finish. I expect that we will be enjoying this wine for 7-10 years, or more, but it offers a lot now.
