Sancerre is of course best known for its white wine, but it produces a small amount of red – always from Pinot Noir. It's always fun if rare to find red Sancerre, a different French take on Pinot. A very appealing nose of strawberry, raspberry, and red cherry, roses, and a touch of smoke leads into a fresh, crunchy palate with a light tannic grip and some peppery spiciness. Very drinkable.

Deep ruby-violet color perfumed with aromas of plums, ripe cherries and dried herbs with a hint of lavender. The rich and intense palate adds plum and herb flavors along with berries, spice, bittersweet chocolate and liquorice, followed by a long, lingering finish.

Only the second release of this wine, the 2010 is a plush, sexy example, featuring a combination of fruity and savory components.
